

TOOLS NEEDED

- Tint (recommended at least 2 colours)
- 10% v. hydrogen peroxide/activating agent
- Vaseline
- Pre-cut tinting/cotton pads
- Eye dropper
- Scissors
- Small mixing bowl/cup
- Rubbing alcohol
- Mirror
- Tissues
- Cotton pads
- Cotton buds
- Eyebrow comb
- Disposable mascara wands
- Lip brushes
- Kidney bowl
- Eye drops
- Warm water

STEP-BY-STEP LASH TINTING

1. PREPARATION

5min

Assess clients colouring and determine appropriate tint colour to enhance their features.

Take a 'before' photo.

Fit a pre-cut tinting pad to the lower lashes and adjust the shape as necessary with scissors.

Apply Vaseline to one side of the eye-area of the tinting pad using a cotton bud, and ask your client to look up – fit the tinting pad along the lower lash line, preventing any Vaseline from going on the lashes themselves.

Ask client to close their eyes and keep them closed for the duration of the tinting process.

Using a cotton bud, apply Vaseline on the skin along the upper lash line, ensuring no Vaseline goes on the lashes themselves.

Take the chosen appropriate tint and squeeze a bean-sized blob into the mixing cup (**NOTE:** this amount may differ according to the tinting brand used). Add 3 drops of 10% v. hydrogen peroxide (or whichever amount of the brand-specific activating agent is required) and mix the tint thoroughly with a lip brush.

2. LASH APPLICATION

11-20min

Using a lip brush, paint the tint on the lashes from base to tip in short zigzag motions. Paint as close to the lash line as possible without getting tint on the skin.

Once all lashes are thoroughly and evenly coated, cover with a dry cotton pad.

3. LASH REMOVAL

5min

Place your fingers under the pre-cut tinting pad below the lower lashes and use it and the covering cotton pad to remove majority of the lash tint. Fold the dry pads over and wipe down gently over the lashes.

Use a damp cotton pad folded into a quarter to do short strokes under and into the lashes.

Keep folding over the same cotton pad until all clean sides have been used before getting a fresh one.

Use a damp cotton bud to stroke between the lashes to ensure all traces of active tint have been removed from the lashes.

Ask your client to look up and wipe any remaining traces of tint from the lower lids.

Hand a mirror to your client to assess the results.

Take an 'after' photo to show your client the comparison.



STEP-BY-STEP BROW TINTING

1. PREPARATION

3min

Assess clients colouring and determine appropriate tint colour to enhance their features.

Take a 'before' photo.

Using a cotton bud, apply Vaseline on the skin around the eyebrows, ensuring no Vaseline goes on the brows themselves.

Take the chosen appropriate tint and squeeze a bean-sized blob into the mixing cup (**NOTE:** this amount may differ according to the tinting brand used). Add 3 drops of 10% v. hydrogen peroxide (or whichever amount of the brand-specific activating agent is required) and mix the tint thoroughly with a lip brush.

2. BROW APPLICATION

1-2min

Brush the brows straight with an eyebrow comb.

Using a mascara wand, apply the tint to the brows by rolling the wand over the hairs to pick them up and coat them evenly.

Speed is of essence to ensure neither brow has the tint on for an extended period of time.

3. BROW REMOVAL

3min

Use a tissue to wipe off majority of the tint, on the first brow you applied tint to, then the other.

Use a damp cotton pad folded into a quarter to wipe against the hair growth of the first brow in firm strokes. Flip the cotton pad over to use a clean edge and keep wiping until the brows are clean of tint. Work fast to ensure the other brow does not have active tint on for a longer period of time.

Use a damp cotton bud to double check all traces of active tint have been removed.

Pass a mirror on to your client to assess the results.

Take an 'after' photo to show your client the comparison.
